Aaron Wilson of Hempstead, N.Y. Receives the Cambridge Who's Who Future Leaders Award

A National Honor Society member, he served as a peer tutor in Spanish, the social sciences and mathematics."

Wilson, named to Who's Who among American High School Students, says his career goal is to become a marketing executive. As an honorary member of Cambridge Who's Who among Executives, Professionals and Entrepreneurs, he will be featured in the honors edition of the

Cambridge Who's Who Registry and will have access to a robust network of Cambridge business professionals.
